The pilot programs initiated by Renewing Dignity in two Duval County Public Schools laid the groundwork for DCPS making free menstrual health products available in all DCPS secondary Title I schools this fall. Together with our amazing partner, Feeding Northeast Florida, we have distributed over 3.7 million tampons and pads helping keep students in school and encouraging participation in sports and other activities while also supporting good mental and physical health. While we have made significant progress, our journey to assure that women menstruate with dignity is far from over.
